Skills Taught:

Big Questions:

Where did the Anglo Saxons come from and why did they come? Why would people leave their homeland to settle in another country? How did the Anglo Saxons live? What was life like in Britain before and after the Anglo Saxons? How did life in Britain change as a result of the Anglo Saxons? Why were the Anglo Saxons important within British history? Why did the Vikings raid Britain? What happened to Edward the Confessor?
